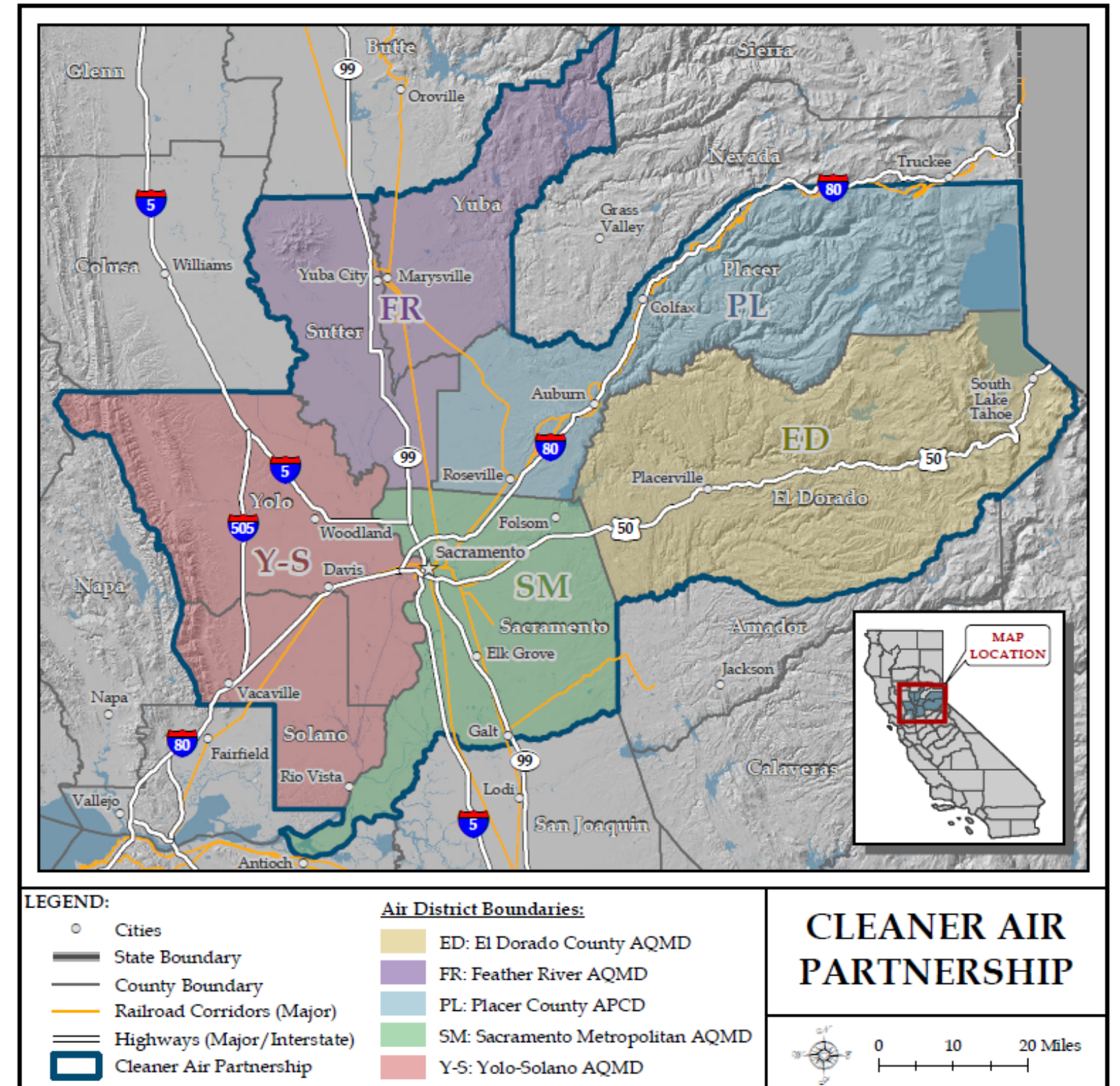
We are a unique public-private partnership across business, transportation, the environment, health, and local government that promotes cleaner air in the Sacramento region.

Partners:



The Sacramento region has serious air quality and public health needs:

- We have large populations within **disadvantaged communities** who are hard-hit by the health problems that our air pollution causes.
- We are not in attainment with **State or Federal health-based air quality standards**, and we will not be for a long time.
- Air quality and public health are critical to a thriving **business environment** that attracts and retains skilled workers.
- Sacramento's air basin is **one of the ten most polluted by ozone and short-term particle pollution in the entire U.S.**, according to the American Lung Association's 2022 State of the Air.
- The region **does not meet the cookie-cutter definition** of an area impacted by air pollution - our region is affected mainly by mobile source pollutants from cars, trucks, and locomotives.

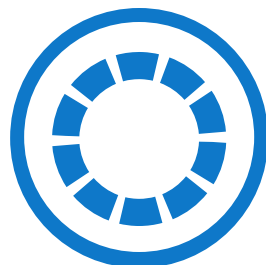


Our Work



Advocacy:

- Annual leadership, recruiting, and staffing of the Air Quality team as part of the Sacramento Metro Chamber's **Capitol-to-Capitol federal advocacy program** and **State Legislative Summit program**.
- In 2018, held **53 in-person meetings** with State Legislators, staff, and CARB leadership in a campaign to successfully advocate for investment in our region's frontline communities as part of the AB 617/Community Air Protection Program.
- In 2021, educated CARB on issues surrounding its implementation of major new requirements for the reporting of Criteria Air Pollutants and Toxic Air Contaminants (**CTR Regulation**), which may result in unintended problems for air districts, the public, and 65,000 regulated businesses across the state.



Regional Coalition Building:

- Serve as a **backbone organization** for our region's clean air advocates, agencies, and regulated industries through participation in regional working groups and coalitions.

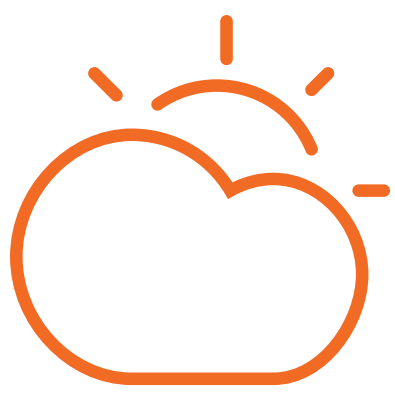


Education & Outreach:
