

Clean Vehicle Purchase Incentives for Income-Eligible Individuals

Individuals can get up to \$12,000 towards the purchase or lease of a zero-emission vehicle through the following incentive projects.



Clean Cars 4 All

Get up to \$12,000 to scrap your older, more polluting vehicle with a cleaner, more fuel-efficient vehicle for residents living in participating air districts. Charging and infrastructure opportunities are also available.

CARB's Low Carbon Transportation Investments Program offers a suite of clean transportation incentives aimed to increase clean vehicle ownership for low-income consumers and access to other clean mobility options for priority communities.

Community-Based Transportation Equity Investments

The following projects and programs support transportation needs other than vehicle ownership, and focus on low-income and disadvantaged communities. Transportation and mobility needs are unique to each community, so CARB offers various options to be flexible and responsive to diverse needs. CARB also offers opportunities that support planning and other activities that build community capacity.



Planning and Capacity Building

Offers grants for communities to assess transportation needs, plan for transportation solutions, build partnerships, strengthen workforce training and development, and conduct outreach and community engagement.



Sustainable Transportation Equity Project

Offers grants for various clean transportation projects, such as active transportation and public transit, that work together to increase residents' ability to get to key destinations without using a personal vehicle.



Clean Mobility in Schools

Offers grants for clean transportation in and around schools, including carshare, active transportation, zero-emission school buses and delivery trucks, zero-emission lawn and garden equipment and education for staff, students and parents.



Clean Mobility Options Voucher Pilot

Offers funding for clean mobility projects, including carshare, bikeshare, ride-hailing and other micro-mobility projects aimed to increase transportation options in communities.
