

2021 In Review: Key Accomplishments

1 We took action to empower communities.

- We completed the [Listos California campaign](#), increasing emergency preparedness in the face of fire, flood, and the pandemic for 3.87 million vulnerable Californians.
- We advanced the goals of [Our Path Forward: The Prosperity Strategy](#) by increasing digital equity and inclusion, advancing sector-based strategies across high growth sectors, and more.
- We worked with community partners and residents of Oak Park and North Sacramento neighborhoods to place 21 [air monitors](#) and advance clean air action plans.
- We launched the [Getting Connected Resource Guide](#) to help local governments increase broadband access and adoption.



2 We delivered actionable research to help our region understand challenges and advance solutions.

- We published the [third COVID-19 Resilience Poll](#) and the [Food Resilience Poll](#) - engaging regional residents and sharing their perspectives across a wide audience.
- We advanced broadband strategic plans and gap analysis in Sacramento, Sutter, Yolo and Yuba counties to clarify [where broadband access needs are and identify action strategies](#).
- We advanced economic recovery priorities through publishing a [Future of Work report](#) containing up-to-date analysis of job posting data to inform rapid reskilling and upskilling of community members impacted by the pandemic.



3 We built and expanded coalitions to align efforts and amplify collective impact.

- We brought together over 160 stakeholders to explore key actions to advance equity strategies for clean jobs through the [Climate, Justice, and Jobs](#) forum.
- We advanced food system resilience through the release of the [Sacramento Region Food System Action Plan](#), engaging more than 200 stakeholders and embedding key priorities across systems.
- Hosted eleven [regional advisories across multiple sectors](#) to facilitate employer and industry engagement and inform development of training programs to meet regional talent needs.
- We launched the Sacramento Coalition for Digital Inclusion [Action Plan](#), the roadmap to advance goals in broadband access and adoption, hardware devices, and digital literacy and skills.



4 We influenced policy to strengthen our communities.

- We led more than 25 legislative meetings and participated in many more through advocacy efforts related to clean air, climate change, emergency preparedness, economic recovery, broadband access, and more.
- We contributed to the successful passage of the Community Economic Resilience Fund, Broadband for All, Listos California program continuation, and more.
- We contributed to [California Forward's 2022 Roadmap to Shared Prosperity](#) and held leadership roles at the annual California Economic Summit.



5 We engaged our community and widened our audience

- We engaged over 1,600 stakeholders through more than 40 hosted public webinars and events.
- Our staff and leadership appeared as invited speakers in more than 70 regional or statewide events and Valley Vision had more than 30 earned media placements.
- We regularly engage over 10,000 subscribers through our news channels.
